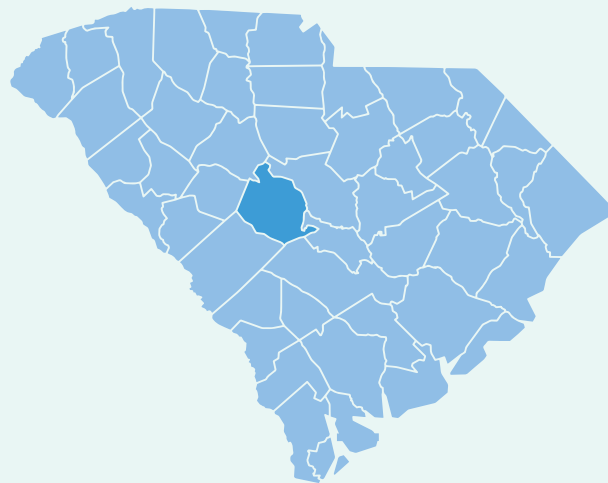

Lexington County First Steps has experienced another year of excellence in parenting programs to include traditional Parents As Teachers (PAT curriculum), Connected Families (also PAT curriculum) serving DSS Referrals, and PASOS assisting new immigrant families to navigate available public services. All programs again exceeded expectations of the projected numbers to serve. In addition, the long-standing Countdown to Kindergarten services for rising 5K since 2004, beginning with 50 students, continues to be a successful program. This summer,188 students received CTK summer home visitations from their 5K teachler-to.be or a qualified teacher.

Undisputed research supports the urgency with which preschool aged children must be surrounded by rich experiences, not only in literacy and numeracy, but also with ample opportunities for motor development and social emotional development in order to beprepared for school.

Lexington County First Steps (LCFS) administers programs such as Parent As Teachers, which provides highly qualified personnel to work with children and families prior to entering school. In addition, the Countdown to Kindergarten summer readiness program for 5K has proven the value of early intervention between the teacher-to-be and the rising kindergartener. LCFS also provides valuable resources to promote school readiness as well as connections to local organizations that help support a child's development and success in school.

Providing group connections across Lexington County in partnership with all 5 School Districts builds community and strengthens protective factors for all our children.

Parents as Teachers

Offers research-based curricula that help families raise children to be healthy, safe, learning, and ready for school.

182 children served 3,112 home visits 129 group meetings and events

Connected Families

Prevents the unnecessary removal of young children from their homes by providing parents and caregivers with voluntary, coordinated services.

56 children served 38 families served 258 home visits

Dolly Parton's Imagination Library

Free, high-quality books mailed to the home of children from birth until age five.

171 children served 2,142 books distributed

Early Identification & Referral

Providing developmental screenings and referrals to other services.

98 children served 83 families served

EARLY CARE & EDUCATION

Training & Professional Development

Certified and registered training hours for the early childhood workforce.

279 children served 8 providers served 17.5 certified training hours

SCHOOL TRANSITION

Countdown to Kindergarten

Supports transitions into kindergarten by connecting incoming students, their families, and their teachers in a series of one-on-one sessions during the summer.

336 children served 2,045 home/school visits

Countdown to 4K

Supports transitions into pre-kindergarten by connecting incoming students, their families, and their teachers in a series of one-on-one sessions during the summer.

136 children served 785 home/school visits

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

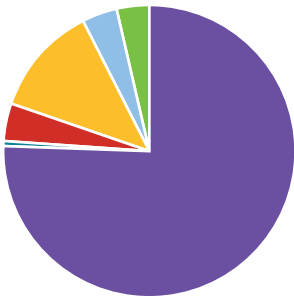

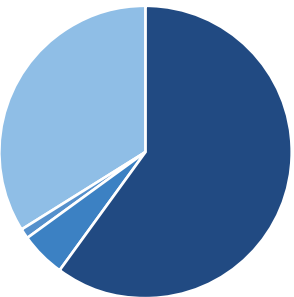
