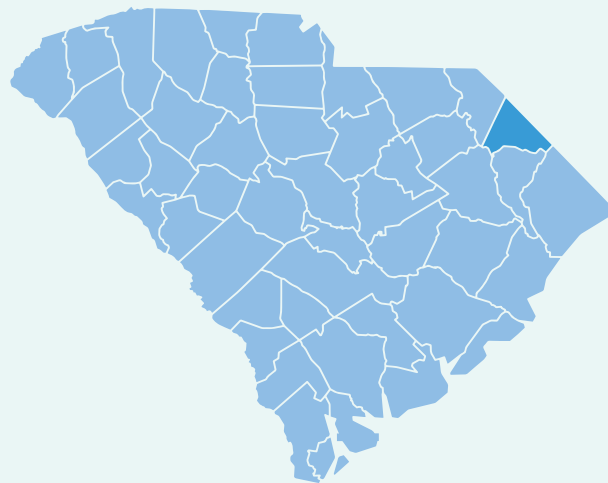

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

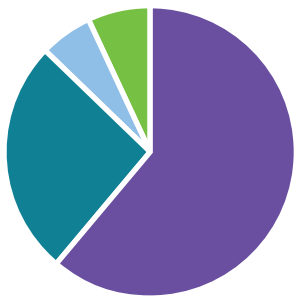

EXPENDITURES

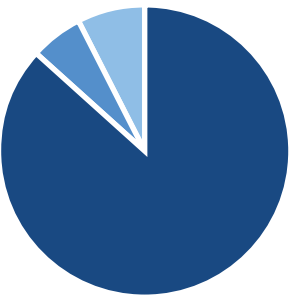
