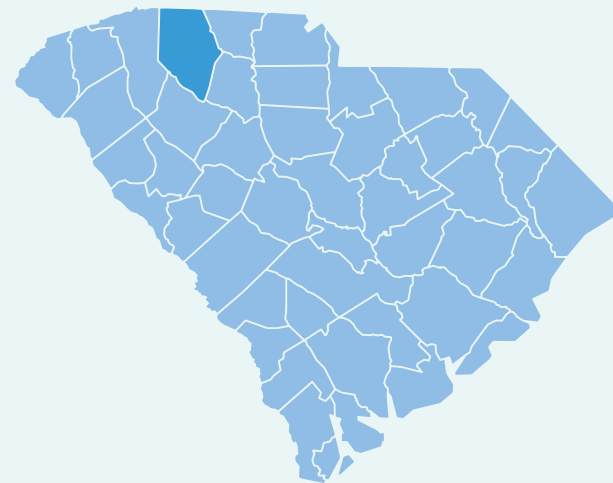

Nurse-Family Partnership

Home visitation for first time mothers, from pregnancy until the child turns two.

155 children served 201 families served 2,469 home visits

Early Identification & Referral

Providing developmental screenings and referrals to other services.

EARLY CARE & EDUCATION

Quality Counts

Certified and registered training hours for the early childhood workforce.

61 providers served 2,455 training hours provided

Early Head Start

A federally funded program that provides family-centered services to infants and toddlers under age 3, pregnant women, and their families.

SCHOOL TRANSITION

Countdown to Kindergarten

Supports transitions into kindergarten by connecting incoming students, their families, and their teachers in a series of one-on-one sessions during the summer.

423 children served 2,505 home/school visits

Countdown to 4K

Supports transitions into pre-kindergarten by connecting incoming students, their families, and their teachers in a series of one-on-one sessions during the summer.

113 children served 669 home/school visits

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

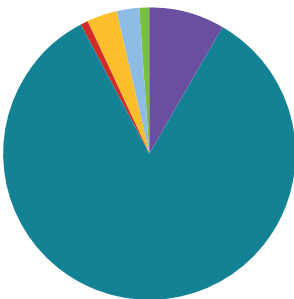

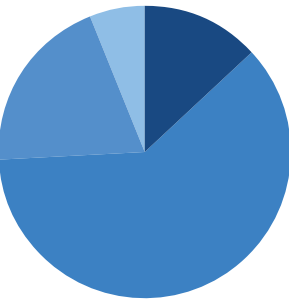
