

September 2024 seems like a million years ago. Our board had explored FY24 data accelerating investments in Dolly Parton's Imagination Library. Then Hurricane Helene began its trek across the south- leaving communities without power and cutoff from essential services. Like thousands, our office was without power, and staff had to work from home. Rather than closing ranks, our Board and staff took action, immediately dispersing Publix gift cards for 50 registered Home-based childcare providers to ensure they could restock their fridge and pantry, and authorizing \$25,000 for emergency supplies (diapers, wipes, formula). I am proud of the work we do on a typical Tuesday- keeping partners supported, ensuring program compliance, and building systems of support within Greenville County. I am MOST PROUD of what our team does when crisis hits- stepping into support where we are most needed.

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS




\$1 = \$1.82


