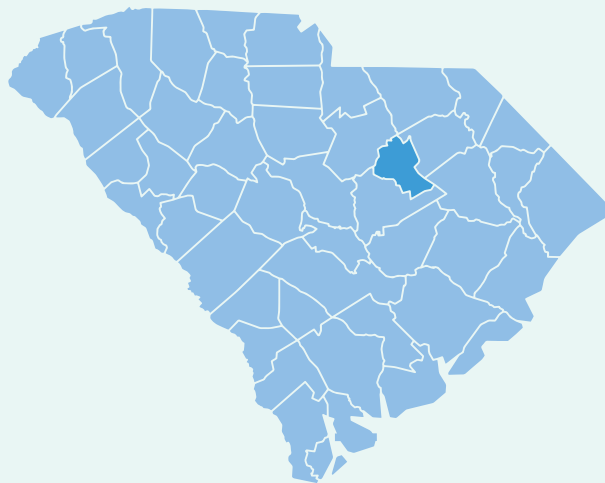

to be chronically absent in kindergarten

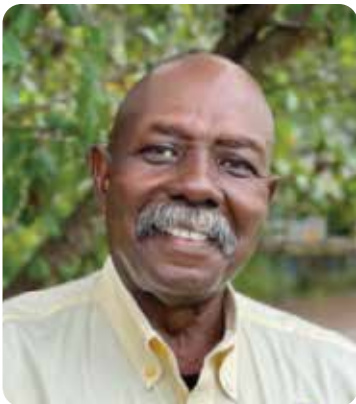
OUR MISSION

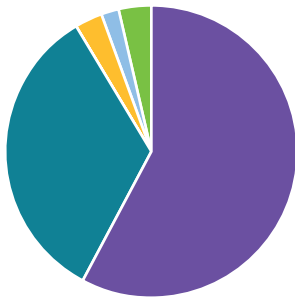

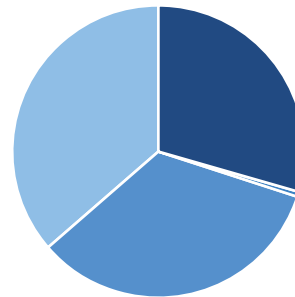
