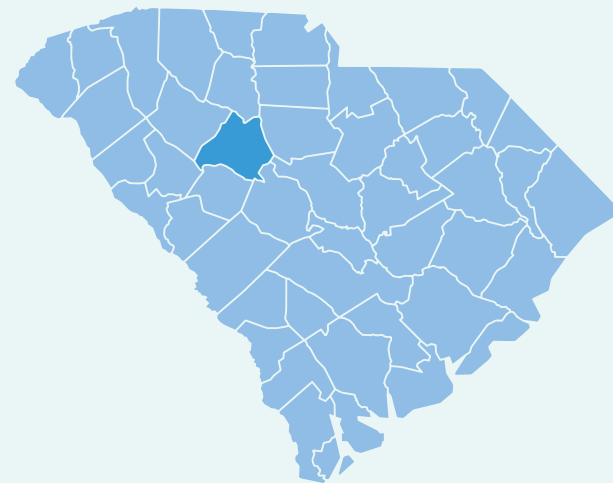

PARENTING

Parents as Teachers

Offers research-based curricula that help families raise children to be healthy, safe, learning, and ready for school.

18 children served 272 home visits 11 group meetings and events

Positive Parenting Program (TripleP)

A parenting and family support system designed to prevent – as well as treat – behavioral and emotional problems in children.

32 children served 27 families served 20 group meetings and events

Library-Based Programs

Connect librarians with child care programs and preschool classrooms, providing books, storytelling, and staff training.

380 children served 20 providers served

Reach Out and Read

Free, high-quality books provided by a child's pediatric provider during doctor's visits.

857 children served 991 books distributed

EARLY CARE & EDUCATION

Quality Counts

Certified and registered training hours for the early childhood workforce.

104 children served 2 providers served 124 training hours provided

Training & Professional Development

Certified and registered training hours for the early childhood workforce.

133 children served 12 providers served 28 certified training hours

SCHOOL TRANSITION

Countdown to Kindergarten

Supports transitions into kindergarten by connecting incoming students, their families, and their teachers in a series of one-on-one sessions during the summer.

76 children served 8 schools served 447 home/school visits

Countdown to 4K

Supports transitions into pre-kindergarten by connecting incoming students, their families, and their teachers in a series of one-on-one sessions during the summer.

35 children served 206 home/school visits

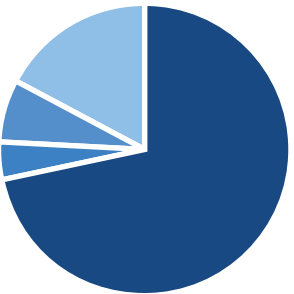
