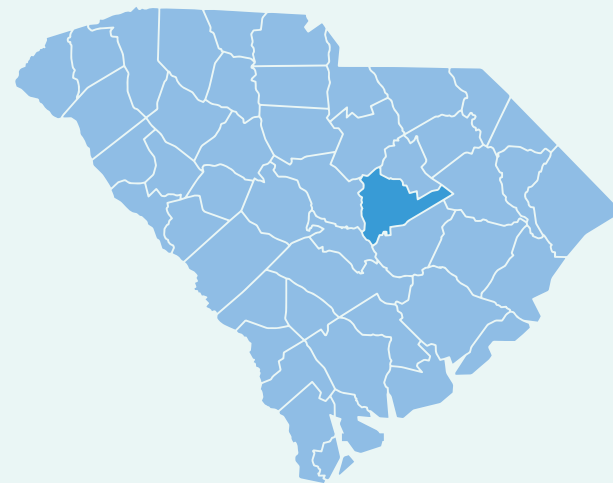

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

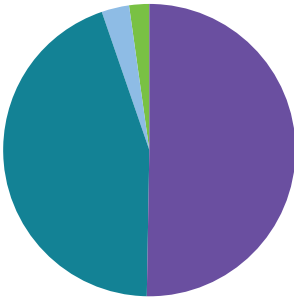

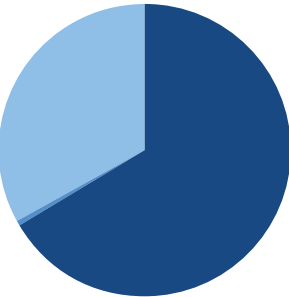
