


OUR MISSION

The mission of Chesterfield County First Steps is to ensure opportunities for young children and their families, so every child enters school healthy and ready to learn

From birth, children embark on a continuous journey of learning, with early experiences playing a pivotal role in shaping their long-term development. Research indicates that children experiencing poverty may enter kindergarten up to a full academic year behind their peers, a disparity that can expand as they advance through school. High-quality early education has the potential to bridge this gap, profoundly influencing a child's trajectory both immediately and over a lifetime. CCFS serves as a local portal connecting families of preschool children to community-based services they may need or desire to ensure the school readiness of their children. We act as a community convener serving the needs of our youngest citizens and their families. A county-wide needs assessment is conducted every three years to assure that our goals are meeting the needs of the most at-risk families in Chesterfield County. We thank our dedicated board, staff and volunteers for their service to young children.

Chesterfield County First Steps to School Readiness Partnership (CCFS) was created in 1999 as an independent nonprofit organization. CCFS is one of 46 County Partnerships charged by the General Assembly with improving the school readiness of South Carolina's young children.

Since its inception, Chesterfield County First Steps has relied on local data, strong partnerships, and evidence-based practices for decision making. Chesterfield County First Steps remains dedicated to improving school readiness, early childcare quality, and family support.

We have established a 24-year history of working with local agencies and organizations. Our network of partners is expanding, and there are ongoing discussions regarding both enhanced and additional services. However, financial resources remain the primary limitation.

Our team evaluates success not only through quantitative metrics, but also by observing positive student engagement upon entry.




