Priorities: Summary


1.Increase Kindergarten Ready Rate

Kindergarten Readiness Assessment (2021) - % Demonstrating Readiness


Abbeville County First Steps will impact school readiness by increasing the number of children participating in the Countdown to Kindergarten Program. This program will be reintroduced to Abbeville County this summer.


Abbeville County First Steps would like to raise these percentages across the board to help ensure every child arriving at kindergarten has the best possible chance for success. These fundamental years of education are critical in a child's development for lifelong learning.

Priority Two: Child Care Desert

More than 50% of Abbeville County is considered to be a childcare desert.

Provider location and center capacity obtained from scchildcare.org on October 16, 2022. Definition of a child care desert obtained from the Center for American Progress, "A child care desert is any census tract with more than 50 children under age 5 that contains either no child care providers or so few options that there are more than three times as many children as licensed child care slots" (https://www.childcaredeserts.org/). Population under age 5 by census tract obtained from the American Community Survey 2016-2020 Five Year Estimates (Table B01001). US Census Bureau. Abbeville County First Steps would like to ensure the childcare centers operating in Abbeville County have quality training and adequate certifications each and every year. The goal is to assist these businesses to remain compliant so that they can continue serving children and families within the county. Keeping child development centers open is a priority due to the limited number of centers that are available that impact kindergarten readiness.

Priority Three: Nurturing Parenting

Abbeville County First Steps would like to connect families of preschool children with services designed to strengthen families and promote optimal child development.

Abbeville County First Steps will partner with local DSS to receive referrals for families who have the highest risk factors. Currently Abbeville County DSS has 20 open investigations. Children between the ages of 0-6 have the highest percentage 0.685% of open cases.

Abbeville County First Steps would like to also implement the Connected Families program to help reduce the number of reoccurring DSS cases in families.

By 2025 Abbeville County First Steps would like to see the Nurturing Parenting Program grow from a minimum of 15 families to 20 families.
