
## THE NEED PERSISTS IN FLORENCE COUNTY

First Steps continues to be an integral part of the community. Our programs have shown significant growth, as we expanded Parent Child Plus, Raising A Reader, Countdown to Kindergarten & Countdown to 4K. We added the HIPPY program, enhanced the Technical Assistant and Quality Enhancement programs and training, as well as increased the number of scholarships awarded to parents, through the childcare scholarship program.

That program served 33 children and 16 providers, providing 33 developmental screenings.

PC+, in collaboration with Florence School District Three, served 30 children and provided over 1498 total home visits. QE program served 9 providers, with 163 TA visits, and 466 children assisted. Served families and children in the RAR, CTK and CT4K program increased as well with 25, 19, and 26 being served respectively.

We continue our work towards one goal: preparing the youngest children within our communities for success.




