Sumter County First Steps (SCFS) has concentrated on strategies that will increase the likeliness of children being prepared to successfully enter school ready to learn.

SCFS is providing a home visitation program to help train parents on how to be their child's first and best teacher. We have chosen Parent s As Teachers (PAT) as a strategy to assist with this goal. PAT is a national model, which is an evidence-based early childhood home visitation program. PAT will increase a parent's knowledge of child development and improves parenting practices.

SCFS is also providing childcare training to childcare providers and Scholarships/ABC Vouchers for quality childcare. Quality childcare is a research-based determinant of school readiness. When you think about the number of hours children are with child care providers, you can understand the importance of quality.

We also support our families with Dolly Pardon Imagination Library to develop an environment, which has a love for reading. An age appropriate book is mailed to the child each month up until their 5^{th} birthday.

SCFS is very appreciative for its collaborations with area partners in early education to include, Early Head Start, Head Start, Sumter School District, Child Find and Child Find Interagency Team. Together we're making a measurable difference.

What We Do...

Each of the six color blocks of the First Steps logo represents a core area of service, outlining our comprehensive strategy to prepare children for long-term school success.

With measurable outcomes across each of its six school readiness strategy areas, First Steps is achieving results.



Healthy Start

We begin with a focus on providing a healthy start to life. This includes prenatal and post-partum services for both mother and baby. In 2007, First Steps collaborated with key philanthropic and agency partners to bring Nurse-Family Partnership to SC having a significant impact on reducing premature births and Medicaid costs.



Quality Childcare

Quality childcare starts with quality childcare providers. Our quality enhancement and training strategies lead to improved teacher-student interaction, which research shows has a significant impact on a child's development and success in school.



Family Strengthening

Our home visitation strategies, such as Parents as Teachers, Parent-Child Home and Early Steps to School Success, are helping parents understand their responsibilities to care for and be positive models for their children. As a result of First Steps' intervention and parenting support, 66% of clients initially assessed at "low" levels of parenting have achieved moderate or high levels of parenting skill.



Early Intervention

According to recent federal evaluations, outcomes for clients participating in BabyNet early intervention programs are above national averages. BabyNet matches the special needs of infants and toddlers



Early Education

Private-public partnerships through First Steps 4K have led to significant cost efficiencies in the delivery of publicly funded 4K. One recent analysis suggests First Steps is achieving comparable results, without the need for costly capital construction, for 80 cents on the dollar.



School Transition

Each of the corresponding blocks of services leads ultimately to the goal of transitioning children successfully to school. Programs like Countdown to Kindergarten and From Day One to Grade One are ultimately preparing children for school success.

ABC Scholarships



Parents play a critical role in their child's development.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Parents as Teachers (PAT) is an evidence-based home visiting program designed to build strong communities, thriving families and children who are healthy, safe and ready to succeed. PAT services include:

- **Personal Visits** at least twice monthly;
- Monthly Group Connections with other PAT families;
- Screenings and Assessments to identify developmental concerns; and
- Connections to Outside Resources that families may need to succeed.

Sumter County First Steps serves families in greatest need. Among our PAT families:

Our PAT program:

- Increases parent knowledge of child development and improves parenting practices
- Provides early detection of developmental delays and
- health issues
- Prevents child abuse and neglect
- Increases children's school readiness and school success

Sumter County First Steps serves families who most need and want our services. Among our PAT families:

29.8%... Live in Poverty

13.5%....Birth to mothers with less than a high school diploma

The 13 children who received assistance with quality childcare were identified with 2 or more at risk factors, which may include developmental delays. Their parents work or attend school. Quality childcare is important

Imagination Library



Children's reading scores improve dramatically when parents are involved in helping them learn to read.

Program Description

According to the Center on the Developing Child at Harvard University, the peak period for children developing neural connections related to language is around **nine months of age. One of the easiest and most effective ways to build the language neural connections in a young child's brain is to read to them.**

Sumter First Steps is the local sponsor of Dolly Parton Imagination Library, which provides free age-appropriate books to children age birth to 5 years. Operated by the Dollywood Foundation, Imagination Library is currently in more than 1,600 communities internationally and mails books to about 700,000 children each month.

Children who register with Sumter First Steps receive one book per month by mail through the month of their fifth birthday. All books are quality, age-appropriate books carefully selected for each age group by a committee of educational specialists.

A major benefit of the Imagination Library program is that it requires very little overhead or administrative obligation. Since the Dollywood Foundation in Tennessee administers the operation and book distribution, the cost to local communities is as low as \$30 per child per year.

Those who care for young children need high-quality, accessible, affordable professional development.

Program Description:

Efforts to improve the quality of child care must include providing affordable, high quality training that meets the needs of the local child care workforce.

First Steps-sponsored training is certified through the SC Center for Child Care Career Development and includes topics in the areas of nutrition, health and safety, curriculum, child guidance, professional development and program administration. Best practices in training include not only the training, but also follow-up with supported practice in the classroom.

- All trainers are master-level trainers with doctorate degrees in Education and have 30+ years of experience in Early Education.
- Incorporated take-home assignments into each session to allow participants to practice the concepts introduced during training sessions; and offered follow-up technical assistance visits for training
