GETTING CHILDREN READY FOR SCHOOL

All children are ready to benefit from a quality kindergarten experience when they are five years old by September 1 of that school year. But kindergarten readiness—the critical stage at which children are prepared for learning and success—is more than a matter of age. For a strong start in school, children need positive relationships and supportive learning environments beginning at birth. At First Steps, we partner with families, caregivers, and communities to ensure that all children are prepared for success.



South Carolina's Profile of the Ready Kindergartner

Developed by SC First Steps and the SC Department of Education, the state's description of school readiness includes 60 developmental milestones across 5 categories:



Approaches to learning & inquiry



Emotional & social development



Physical development, self-help & motor skills



Mathematical thinking



Language & literacy development

OUR GOALS



In support of the Profile of the Ready Kindergartner, our approach is focused on advancing York County toward the following strategic goals:

- **Goal 1** Coordinate efforts to profile all 4K Programs offered in York County and provide parents and 4K Providers the coordination and tools to reach more children by casting a wider net within the County.
- Goal 2 Transition from current Quality Enhancement Program to Quality Counts with our Child Care Partners.
- **Goal 3** Continue to expand our Nurse-Family Partnership Program to reach more at risk first time mothers and their children.

PIVOTING FOR COVID-19

When the coronavirus pandemic forced South Carolina to shut down in March 2020, York County First Steps quickly pivoted to provide much-needed support to young children, their families and child care providers.

Our work has never been more critical. While children are at low risk for the serious health effects of the virus, the crisis is having a profound impact on their wellbeing and development. For children of color and low-income communities, these impacts are expected to be even more damaging. That is why York County First Steps is enhancing our efforts to provide parents and caregivers with the services and resources they need to weather this storm.

COVID-19 created new issues and concerns as well as worsen existing conditions in many communities. York County First Steps worked to fill gaps in community services and expanded our reach to meet the increasing needs to include:

- Helping to provide healthy food access to communities hit hard by the Pandemic
- Facilitating conversations and exploring new options for childcare and after school care in response to new school schedules
- Adapting our NFP and PAT programs to virtual visits to maintain services



NURSE-FAMILY PARTNERSHIP



Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP) helps transform the lives of first-time mothers and their babies.

Through ongoing home visits from registered nurses, moms receive the care and support they need to have a healthy pregnancy, provide responsible and competent care for their children, and become more economically self-sufficient. From pregnancy until the child turns two years old, Nurse-Family Partnership Nurse Home Visitors form a much-needed, trusting relationship with their clients, instilling confidence and empowering them to achieve a better life for their children – and themselves.

Parents as Teachers (PAT) is a home visiting program designed to build strong communities, thriving families and children who are healthy, safe and ready to succeed. PAT services include:



Personal visits from a parent educator at least twice monthly



Monthly group connections with other PAT families



Screenings and assessments to identify developmental concerns



Connections to outside resources that families may need to succeed

PAT GOES VIRTUAL

Due to COVID-19, Parents as Teachers (PAT) National provided guidance for affiliates to deliver virtual services via interactive video conferencing and phone calls. South Carolina PAT affiliates rose to the occasion by engaging families in creative and meaningful ways while continuing to meet the Essential Requirements of implementing a quality PAT program during the pandemic.

COUNTDOWN TO KINDERGARTEN



Developed by South Carolina First Steps – and identified as a promising state practice by the National Governor's Association in 2005 – Countdown to Kindergarten (CTK) is a home visitation program pairing the families of rising kindergartners with their future teachers during the summer before school entry. Teachers complete six visits with each family, establishing strong connections during the summer that facilitate classroom learning throughout the year.

Our Countdown to Kindergarten Program benefits from close partnerships with our School Districts and with the Children's Museum of York County. Each year we co-host a Celebration for rising Kindergarten children and their families. Families are connected to School District resources and community services for families with young children.





CHILD CARE QUALITY ENHANCEMENT



Many private child care centers strive to provide high quality care but lack the resources often available to publicly-funded early childhood programs. Our Child Care Quality Enhancement (QE) program aims to produce measurable improvements in the quality of care provided to young children.

CHILD CARE SCHOLARSHIPS



For many families in York County, the cost of quality childcare is out of reach. Our scholarship program makes payments to childcare providers to care for children from teenage mothers working to complete their high school degree.

All parents are entered into one of Parents as Teachers Programs and receive this evidenced based program as part of their overall services. The teenage parent must continue to attend school while receiving the childcare scholarship. Having the teenage mother complete their degree, removes at least one potential risk factor for the child's eventual education success.

This program has been able to assist teenage mothers strike the delicate balance between being a nurturing parent and an active high school student. This program has achieved an 85% success rate with our families either being retained from one school year to the next or graduating from high school.



FOUR-YEAR-OLD KINDERGARTEN



South Carolina First Steps provides eligible children with free enrollment in full-day four-year-old kindergarten. In coordination with First Steps local partnerships and more than 230 private, community and faith-based preschool providers, First Steps 4K expands access to quality early education across the state.



ELIGIBILITY

To qualify for enrollment, a child must be:



4 years old on or before September 1



Eligible for Medicaid, SNAP or TANF, experiencing homelessness or transiency, or in foster care


